## Knights pass endurance test

Just when Alyssa Sorenson thought she had maxed out on energy, she found a much needed second wind.

The overexertion was well worth it.

The Central Catholic sophomore defeated Harrison's Kate Sutton in a four-hour marathon match 6-4, 6-7 (3), 7-5 to seal a sectional championship for the Knights. CC defeated the Raiders 3-2 after losing to them 4-1 in the regular season.

"I had nothing left," Sorenson said. "When we went into the third set, I was sitting and shaking because I was so tired. I had to eat a banana and drink a whole bottle of Gatorade just to get something in me to keep going."

Sorenson redeemed herself for a regular-season loss to Sutton and helped CC win its second sectional title and first since 2006.

"When the fans look, they say, Well you beat them 4-1, you should win," Raiders coach George Adeyemi said. "We coaches know it's harder than that. The regular season doesn't mean anything."

Almost simultaneously, Harrison's No. 2 doubles team of Sandy Lauter and Jenny Blackburn and CC's No. 1 doubles team of Hali Reifenrath and Sarah Penix won in two sets, tying the score 1-1.

Ann Yaacoub put the Knights up 2-1 after upsetting Kemi Adeyemi at No. 1 singles. Yaacoub lost to Adeyemi 6-1, 6-0 during the regular season, but scored the three-set victory on Saturday.

"My coach told me to bring out her weaknesses instead of me making the errors," Yaacoub said. "I had to force her to make errors Yaacoub on her backhand."



Katie Sly's three-set win at No. 2 singles knotted the match 2-2 and set up Sorenson's heroics.

It was a welcome atmosphere for the Knights' No. 3 singles player.

Usually an overpowering player who plays a fast-paced style, Sorenson decided to keep the ball in play until she found a favored chance to fire a winning shot.
